My Dear Friends and Family members,

With a heart full of mixed emotions, I express my deep gratitude as I prepare to embark on a new chapter in my journey as Parish Priest at St Joseph's Parish Murgon and St Joseph's Parish Gayndah. It was a great blessing and very joyous and rewarding years for me while pastoring OLW Petrie & SFX Dayboro, which has been my home for the past 5 years. It is tough for me to leave this family with whom I am immensely bonded.

I fondly remember you affectionately welcoming me with open arms and lots of joy and love. You were with me as my family in my ups and downs to support me and strengthen me, to pray for me and to care for me, and you cared for me like your son, brother, or a best friend. I really enjoyed your care and never felt anything deficient here. I have tried the best way to serve the Parish and its ministries and I loved working with you all. I am truly privileged to be part of the most intimate moments of some of your lives while celebrating sacraments or being with you in times of grief and loss.

When I reflect, I realize that I have learned so much from all of you during the past five years. Most importantly, you loved me despite my shortcomings and imperfections which is worth more than anything. I have been overwhelmed and inspired by your support to the parish in every small or big task that aims to accomplish our church's vision. It was unique for me to witness the parishioners serving the community with utmost dedication, punctuality, self-determination, and mindful voluntary services, and I often express it to my friends and family at home. I saw that the power of our faith and Christ's love work together in our parish to keep us united to achieve JESUS's Mission.

As you know, Petrie is my first Parish in Australia as a Parish Priest and you are a blessing to me in my pastoral ministry. I want to thank and appreciate each of you for the prayers, kindness, and love you offered me during these five years. I am grateful to our parish administration team for their immense support that helped me in organizing every parish activity and I thank each ministry members and the parishioners for its unwavering support which was a strong pillar of strength to me.

I also want to humbly apologize and ask your forgiveness if anytime I have offended you or did not have time for. Please know that it was never intentional or personal. The new appointment at Murgon and Gayndah where the Catholic community is undergoing spiritual starvation for the sacred sacraments and the God's Word without a full-time Parish Priest, was offered to me by Archbishop Mark and his Priests Council. Though changing to a remote place can be difficult, I believe in the spiritual discernment of the Archbishop and God's Divine plan for me. The missionary priesthood is always challenging, but I choose to oblige to my superiors. I am sure that I will be blessed the way I was blessed at Petrie.

God always has His plans in His time which are beyond our expectations. During the Episcopal meeting, When I was asked, I only said 'Yes' believing that God found me as the best person to serve these communities. If I lacked faith, I might have run away like Jonah! But when I thought of Mother Mary who accepted the virgin conception to give birth to Jesus, the Son of God, I didn't have a second thought. Jesus says, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel" and "You shall be my witnesses in Jerusalem, Judea, and Samaria, and to the end of the earth" (Mark 16:15& Acts 1:8).

The transition to a remote place would be challenging as each parish and station churches in this remote area lies almost 100 km apart with very little population and limited facilities. But I believe that it is from the Holy Spirit and am hopeful and confident in God our Provider, Jehovah Jireh, who will guide me in my new ministry, new routine, long travels, and with all the limitations. As far as God is with me and His divine providence, I shall try my level best to do pastoral care in the country parishes and mass centers in these extremely interior remote areas.

We have worked together as a team for our parish and parishioners keeping Jesus at the center and I pray that it will further bloom stronger in faith, love, and service under the new Parish Priest who will be appointed shortly. I pray that whatever strength we had as a parish family may be continued and whatever shortcomings may be overcome. I ask also that you pray for the new priest, embrace him, and love him the way you loved me. In the meantime, the representatives from the College of Consultors will have a parish gathering with you to discuss the future needs of our parish.

As I prepare for my new assignment, I carry with me and cherish the experience and memories I had with you here. You may not be able to support me physically, but I humbly seek your spiritual support in prayers that God may grant me the strength and wisdom to pastor the parishes entrusted to my care. Though I move forward, you all will be in my thoughts and prayers and you will be sadly missed. God bless you all always.
